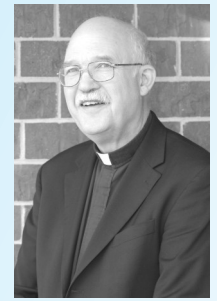

## Father Harry's "Buseness"

This Wednesday, March 9, is Ash Wednesday, As you might suspect, this is about the latest time Lent can fall. Lent means Spring and we will be observing this holy season almost totally during spring this year. We associate Lent with penance and conversion. But more than anything else, this season calls us to grow closer to God. St. Leo Parish will be offering a variety of spiritual opportunities during Lent.



- I invite all of you to begin your Lenten journey by participating in **Ash Wednesday** Mass at 6:40am, 8:00am, 12:00noon, 5:30pm or 7:00pm. Come to hear God's word in scripture, to receive Jesus in the Eucharist and to receive the ashes as a sign of your intention of conversion and spiritual growth during this holy season.
- I also encourage you to continue to attend weekday Mass through out Lent. You may attend **weekday Mass** at St. Leo at 6:40 or 8:00am. For those who are not able to attend morning Mass, there is a variety of other options at surrounding parishes, including the 5:30pm weekday Mass at St. Pius X.
- We will also pray the **Stations of the Cross** every Friday throughout Lent at 5:30pm.
- This year's **Parish Mission** will be led by Father Larry Gillick and Sister Bernadette O'Reilly from Monday to Wednesday, March 28, 29 & 30. They will offer sessions at 11:00am and again at 7:00pm.
- On Saturday, March 12, Sister Ginny Silvestri, OSM, will lead the women of the parish in our annual **Women's Retreat**.
- On Saturday, March 19(the feast of St. Joseph), Father Kevin Schneider, S.J. will lead the men of the parish in our annual **Men's Retreat**.
- Finally, mark your calendars for our **Lent penance services**: April 18 & 19 @ 7:00pm and April 20 @ 1:30pm.

I encourage participation in all of these enrichment opportunities.

You will have opportunities to give alms for the poor this Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we will take a collection at all Masses for the **St. Vincent de Paul Society**. This collection supports assistance to the poor in our local community. We will also participate in **Operation Rice Bowl**. Contributions to the Rice Bowl support Catholic Relief Services to provide assistance throughout the world. This year, St. Leo Parish will participate in the **Pro-Life Campaign**, 40 days for life. This campaign invites people to join together for 40 days of fervent prayer and fasting for the end of abortion. I invite St. Leo parishioners to join this vigil on Friday, March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation. St. Leo Parishioners will be praying at the Planned Parenthood site at 3105 North 93rd Street. 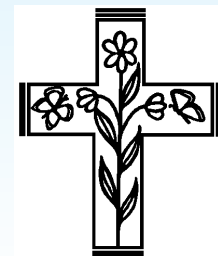

### A Note from our Parish Nurse

If you are 50 or older, you need to think about colon cancer. Most colon cancers occur in men and women who are 50 or older and most people who get colon cancer have no family history of the disease. You can have the disease and not even know it. You have the power to stop colon cancer before it starts. Colon cancer begins with a growth (a polyp) that is not yet cancer. Testing can help your doctor tell whether there is a problem. Most people who have polyps removed never get colon cancer.

I will have the colon cancer screening kits available (fecal occult blood tests) for anyone 50 years and older that would like to participate free of charge. I plan to attend the 8 am Mass every Wednesday in March so come chat with me after Mass, we'll talk about the test, check blood pressures or just share some hot tea, soda bread and good conversation.

## “Skins” Gone Too Far?

In the last five weeks, I have been speaking to the middle school and high school youth about sexuality. We talk a lot about how the media influences them, and the TV shows that portray sexuality in a very negative way.

MTV’s new racy show “Skins” is everywhere. Not only did its premiere episode attract more than 3 million viewers, it’s been written about in hundreds of newspapers, magazines and blogs. The sexually charged show features high school students who routinely have sex, drink alcohol and do drugs.

The show is rated TV-MA and includes the appropriate disclaimer in the beginning of each show. That rating means that it may not be suitable for teens under 17. But still, kids as young as 12 years old are watching the show. And many of the actors are under the age of 18. The Parents Television Council asked the Department of Justice to investigate whether an upcoming episode violates federal child pornography statutes.

MTV says this: “Skins is a show that addresses real-world issues confronting teens in a frank way. We also have taken numerous steps to alert viewers to the strong subject matter so that they can choose for themselves whether it is appropriate.”

Media expert Mark Joyella says all this controversy and all this media attention may spell success for the sexually charged show, but cautions parents, that if you’re letting MTV teach your kids, you might deserve what you get.

After speaking with many parents over the last few weeks, many of you haven’t even heard of this show. I would say this. Be proactive in learning about your child’s TV viewing habits. Watch the shows with them and talk about them. Does the show send a message that holds true to your values and our Catholic faith? How would they react in these situations? It’s a good conversation to have with your children, and can be a great teaching moment with your kids.

## Lenten Disciplines and Regulations

**Prayer**—Possible ways to observe: Attendance at Sunday and weekday Mass, Spiritual Reading, Praying the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, Family Prayer including Question of the Week, attend a Parish Retreat and the Lenten Parish Mission.

**Fasting**—By Church Law, Catholics, ages 18-58 are to take only one full meal and two lesser meals on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. There is no eating between meals. All Catholics over the age of 14 are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, and all Fridays during Lent.

**Almsgiving or Giving to the Poor**—Possible ways to observe: Contribute to the Ash Wednesday collection for the St. Vincent de Paul Society, participate in the Rice Bowl Program, Contribute to Catholic Relief Services on Sunday, April 3. There is a long tradition of combining acts of almsgiving with acts of fasting thus making both disciplines more meaningful.

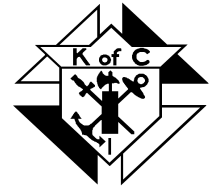
